# OUR REFERRAL CRITERIA

#### Students who are:

- Living in social housing (council housing/family receive housing benefit)
- Eligible for Free School Meals
- Eligible for Pupil Premium Funding
- Classified as a Child Looked After are automatically eligible for our programmes outside school

#### Students who have:

- Special Educational Needs
- English as an Additional Language
- Young carer status
- Refugee or asylum seeker status
   may be eligible for our programme if they
   meet two of the above criteria,

or

meet one of the above crteria **and** will also be in the first generation of their family to attend university in the UK.

## OUR PROGRAMME

The **Into**University programme is designed to be a long-term academic and pastoral service for students from the age of seven to eighteen.

Your students who work with us in the FOCUS programme in your school may also be able to take advantage of our other programmes outside school.

This includes Academic Support, Mentoring and other Enrichment opportunities.

# SECONDARY ACADEMIC SUPPORT

Monday and Thursday

Secondary Academic Support runs twice a week for students aged 11–18.

Students can bring homework set by their teachers and receive support to complete it from **Into**University staff or trained volunteers.

If students do not have homework, they can complete tasks within our **Future**Readiness Award, an exclusive IntoUniversity programme designed within our network to develop students' metacognition and transferrable soft skills.

Students' homework is always prioritised.

#### **MENTORING**

Students aged 11–17 may be paired with a current university student to work on **social**, **academic** and **future** goals. This one to one mentoring aims to develop students' aspiration and knowledge of higher education.

### **HOLIDAY FOCUS**

We run free holiday programmes throughout the year, open to any student who meets our referral criteria. As spaces are limited, our Academic Support students will be prioritised for places.

### **EXAM SUPPORT**

We run SATS, KS4 and KS5 revision sessions ahead of the Summer Term.

## **ENRICHMENT**

For older students, we provide **exclusive** enrichment opportunities with corporate partners and universities.

### VOLUNTEERING

Students aged 16 and over may be able to volunteer at our sessions for Primary students to gain experience.

# PRIMARY ACADEMIC SUPPORT

Tuesday or Wednesday

Primary Academic Support runs once a week for students aged 7-11. There are two Primary groups at the centre.

Students can bring homework set by their teacher and receive support to complete it from **Into**University staff or trained volunteers.

If students do not have homework, they can participate in our **Primary Curriculum**, with literacy and numeracy activities and learning objectives linked to national curriculum statutory requirements.

Students' homework is always prioritised.
